ATTENDEE DECLARATION, CONSENT, WAIVER & TERMS OF PARTICIPATION

Budva, Montenegro - 3 October 2026

By submitting an application, registering for, receiving accreditation for, or attending the Emergency Response & Awareness Conference (ERAC 2026) (the "Event"), the applicant/attendee confirms that they have read, understood, and agree to the following terms and conditions.

1. Accuracy and Authenticity of Information

The applicant confirms that all information, personal data, statements, credentials, identification details and documents submitted as part of the registration or accreditation process are true, accurate, current, authentic and lawfully provided. False, misleading, altered, fraudulent or otherwise illegitimate information or documentation may result in rejection of the application or immediate cancellation of accreditation without refund and, where appropriate, referral to the competent authorities. The Event Organiser may reasonably verify submitted information for accreditation, security, legal or organisational purposes.

2. Data Protection and GDPR

Personal data collected in connection with registration, accreditation, security, administration, communication and organisation of the Event will be processed in accordance with applicable data-protection legislation, including the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (GDPR) where applicable, and applicable national data-protection laws. By submitting the application, the applicant acknowledges having been informed about the collection and processing of personal data and confirms having read and understood the applicable Privacy Notice. Personal data may be shared with authorised Event partners, service providers, venues, security providers, accreditation providers or competent public authorities where reasonably necessary for Event administration, safety, security or legal compliance. Personal data will not be sold to third parties.

3. Photography, Video and Audio Recording

The attendee understands that the Event may be professionally photographed, filmed, livestreamed, broadcast and/or audio recorded. The attendee may appear incidentally or as part of general Event coverage in photographs, video, audio, interviews, livestreams or other audiovisual material. To the extent permitted by applicable law, the attendee authorises the Event Organiser and its authorised partners to use, reproduce, publish, display, distribute, edit, communicate and archive such Event material for Event reporting, public relations, media relations, websites, social media, promotional and marketing materials, future ERAC event promotion, educational and informational materials, printed and digital publications, and commercial promotional activities connected with the Event or its organisers. Where separate consent is legally required for a particular use, such consent shall be obtained in accordance with applicable law.

4. No Compensation for Event Media

To the extent permitted by applicable law, the attendee acknowledges that no payment, royalty, fee or other financial compensation shall be due solely because the attendee appears in authorised photographs, video recordings, audio recordings or general Event coverage. Attendance does not give an attendee ownership rights in official photographs, recordings, broadcasts or other media created by or on behalf of the Event Organiser.

5. Personal Photography and Respect for Other Attendees

Attendees must respect the privacy, dignity and reasonable expectations of other guests, speakers, delegates, VIPs, Event personnel and participants. Before intentionally photographing, filming or recording another identifiable attendee for publication on social media, websites, media platforms or other public channels, attendees should obtain that person's permission where appropriate. Photography or recording in restricted, private, security-sensitive, backstage or specifically designated no-photography/no-recording areas is prohibited. A substantiated complaint concerning intrusive, inappropriate, harassing or unauthorised photography, filming, recording or publication may result in a warning, restriction of photography privileges, or withdrawal of accreditation and removal from the Event.

6. Conduct and Behaviour

All attendees must behave professionally and respectfully and comply with reasonable instructions issued by the Event Organiser, venue management, security personnel and competent authorities. Threatening, abusive, discriminatory, harassing, violent, seriously disruptive, intoxicated, unsafe or otherwise inappropriate behaviour will not be tolerated. Any person who disrupts the Event, compromises the safety or comfort of others, interferes with Event operations, or refuses to comply with reasonable instructions may have their accreditation or attendance pass immediately suspended or revoked and may be required to leave the premises. Security personnel or competent authorities may be contacted where circumstances warrant.

7. Accreditation and Access

Event accreditation is personal and, unless expressly authorised otherwise, non-transferable. The Event Organiser reserves the right to refuse entry, restrict access to particular areas, or revoke accreditation where reasonably necessary for security, safety, capacity, legal, organisational or conduct-related reasons. Attendees may be required to display accreditation and present identification upon reasonable request. Unauthorised transfer, reproduction, alteration, lending or misuse of an accreditation pass may result in immediate cancellation.

8. Security and Safety

Attendees agree to comply with all applicable venue security and safety procedures. Where permitted by law and venue policy, access may be subject to reasonable security measures, including accreditation checks, identity verification, security screening and inspection of bags or belongings. Prohibited, dangerous or unlawful items may not be brought onto Event premises.

9. Food, Beverages and Allergens

Food and beverages provided during the Event, including networking receptions, catering breaks or associated functions, may contain or have come into contact with allergens including, without limitation, gluten, milk/lactose, eggs, nuts, peanuts, soy, sesame, fish and shellfish. Attendees with allergies, intolerances, dietary restrictions or other special dietary requirements are responsible for notifying the venue and/or designated catering provider sufficiently in advance and, where appropriate, confirming their requirements with catering staff before consuming food or beverages. While reasonable efforts may be made to accommodate notified requirements, neither the Event Organiser nor the venue can guarantee an entirely allergen-free environment or completely exclude cross-contamination. To the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, the Event Organiser accepts no liability for allergic reactions or adverse effects arising from food or beverages where the attendee failed to disclose relevant requirements or where circumstances were outside the Event Organiser's reasonable control. Nothing in these Terms excludes or limits liability where prohibited by law.

10. Personal Property

Attendees remain responsible for their personal belongings at all times. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Event Organiser accepts no responsibility for loss, theft or damage to personal property unless caused by circumstances for which liability cannot legally be excluded.

11. Programme, Speakers and Event Changes

The Event Organiser may modify the programme, timetable, speakers, panel composition, venue arrangements, seating, catering arrangements or other Event elements where reasonably necessary. Such changes do not automatically entitle an attendee to compensation or reimbursement unless required by applicable law or expressly provided under the applicable registration/refund policy.

12. Cancellation and Force Majeure

The Event Organiser shall not be responsible for failure, postponement, interruption or modification of the Event caused by circumstances beyond its reasonable control, including severe weather, natural disasters, public-health emergencies, government restrictions, security incidents, civil disturbance, transportation disruption, power failure, venue closure or other force-majeure circumstances. Any refund or rescheduling arrangements will be governed by the applicable registration/refund policy and mandatory law.

13. Intellectual Property

Event branding, logos, presentations, publications, programme materials, graphics, photographs, recordings and other protected materials remain the intellectual property of their respective owners. Attendance does not grant permission to reproduce, commercially exploit, distribute, rebroadcast or otherwise use protected Event materials except where expressly authorised.

14. Speakers and Presentations

Views and opinions expressed by individual speakers, panellists, experts, partners, sponsors or attendees are their own and do not necessarily represent the official position of ERAC, the Event Organiser, its partners, sponsors or the venue. Information presented is for informational and educational purposes and should not automatically be interpreted as professional, legal, medical, security or other specialist advice.

15. Removal from the Event

Where accreditation is revoked because of serious misconduct, violation of these Terms, security concerns, fraudulent registration or refusal to comply with reasonable Event or venue instructions, the attendee may be removed from the premises and lose access to remaining Event activities. Where permitted by applicable law and the applicable refund policy, removal resulting from the attendee's own misconduct may occur without entitlement to a refund.

16. Acceptance of Terms

By submitting the registration/application, the applicant confirms that they have read and understood these ERAC 2026 Attendee Declaration, Consent, Waiver & Terms of Participation and the applicable Privacy Notice; that all information and

documentation submitted is true, accurate and authentic; and that they agree to comply with Event rules, venue requirements, safety and security instructions, media provisions and standards of conduct described above. Where the registration platform uses an electronic checkbox or other electronic acceptance mechanism, such acceptance constitutes the applicant's confirmation of these Terms to the extent permitted by applicable law.
